MEMBERSHIP NUMBERS NEEDED URGENTLY

If you are one of the dozen or so Club Secretaries who have yet to provide our Treasurer with your membership details please, please do it straight away. He has to submit the information to Sports Council Wales within the week in support of our Grant application. He needs to know membership numbers split between Male and Female for both adults and juniors. Use this <u>link</u> to do it now.

The clubs that have provided both 2007 and 2006 figures show a net gain of 57 members on a 2006 base of 1137 - which is 5%. On the whole, the larger clubs seem to be doing better than the small ones.

The proportion of female cavers in the replies received so far is 22% and seems fairly consistent from club to club. Junior members account for less than 1%, with most clubs having none at all.

OGOF CRAIG A'R FFYNNON - Transfer of Access Administration

It's taken longer than envisaged for CCW to get permission to take responsibility for access to Craig a'r Ffynnon, but at last we have the go-ahead for MLCMAC to issue permits and keys to the cave. Lynne Bailey has agreed to act as permit secretary, and the process of applying for access will be exactly the same as for Agen Allwedd. Most of the permit rules will be the same - BCA member clubs (or equivalent), maximum party size 8, no carbide, etc. A stamped addressed envelope and deposit for £10 should be enclosed with applications. Local clubs with an interest in the cave will be offered annual keys.

It is hoped that the transfer will take place at the end of October, but this is not definite. If you have a trip already booked during November or later, it would be a good idea to contact Lynne in case the transfer doesn't go quite as smoothly as we'd like.

LITTLE NEATH ACCESS

Reports of access problems in the upper Neath Valley have recently appeared elsewhere. I am assured that there is no problem of access in the Neath Valley. The Lewis family of Blaen Nedd has agreed to indefinitely extend the access agreement with CCC.

FIXED AIDS IN DAN YR OGOF

Fixed aids in the cave have been upgraded with the help of a £500 grant from the Brecon Beacons National Park. This has included the installation of a stainless steel fixed ladder on the Abyss which, it is hoped, will encourage more parties to do the Round Trip in the upward direction and ensure that flotation aids do not all end up at the far end of the Green Canal. The route up The Rising, the Birthday Passage traverses and the North Aven have now been fitted with fixed lines on stainless steel canyon anchors. Only the Great North Road pitch needs to be rigged in order to reach the Far North. The chain ladder at The Rising will shortly be replaced with a new stainless steel chain ladder.

SUMMER HOLIDAYS

A party of 8 from **Hades** visited the **Henne Morte** for two weeks in August, staying in a superb gite near Castelbiague. It was a first visit to the area so we had to do some entrance hunting and following a tip from some locals we found the blue formations. In a total of 20 caving trips we visited 13 different entrances, completing seven through trips. We enjoyed the area and will be returning.

TUNNEL CAVE

Work on the airlock between Tunnel Cave and Cathedral Cave has been completed and a new "caver flap" will shortly be installed in the outer gate to Cathedral Cave. Once this has been done, access arrangements for throughtrips will be published.

CAVE ECOSYSTEM PROJECT

Andy Lewington's cave ecosystem project is complete and will be online within a month. It will provide information to allow cavers to be able to identify many of the organisms that live in the Welsh caves and understand the relationships between them. There will be a link to it from the CCC website

EXPEDITION GRANTS

Grants for expeditions are now to be administered by WSA (voluntary group for sports clubs) but applications will still have to initially be sent to SCW. Groups wishing to apply will have to be Welsh, have Welsh parentage or be resident in Wales for majority of expedition members to be eligible. Applications for next year must be in by 31st December 2007.
